## **River Villages, Inc. - Oil Spill Response Team**

The Stevens Village Oil Spill team, which is administered under River Villages, Inc, conducts its quarterly trainings at Pump Station 6. The fall training was held during the first week of October. Team members who participated in this training included Deborah George, Pete Hjelm, Lee Ann Ivey, Simon Matthew, John Mayo, Maureen Mayo, Christopher Moses, Angela Smoke, Gary Smoke, and Henry Smoke.

Alyeska has incorporated online classes in addition to the regular hands on and classroom training. This will enable oil team members to stay current on their Hazwoper requirements that are needed to be a qualified oil spill worker. In addition to the online and classroom training, a one day exercise was done which mocked a fake spill coming out of Erickson Creek and spilling into Hess Creek, which is located about 10 miles from Pump Station 6. It involved setting up a "boom", which is equipment specifically used for containment of oil on waterways. The next quarterly training is tentatively set for the end of November.

*Dinyee shareholders and Stevens Village descendents are encouraged to apply for the team. You must be at least 18 years of age, be able to pass mandatory pre-employment drug testing, be in good physical condition, and live in Fairbanks or Stevens Village. It is paid training and is a great way to get experience and get involved in Dinyee Corporation and the oil industry.
